September 20th 2021 Our AGM will preceed the talk described.	THE IMPORTANCE OF SEEDS A joint presentation by Laura Jennings and Jamie Preston . Join Kew Garden's botanist Laura to learn about what a herbarium is, how seeds are banked, and the partnerships formed to enable seed and plant conservation. Laura specialises in the endemic plants of Indonesia and will show how the herbarium is used to conserve and map them. National Trust Lead Ranger Jamie will discuss their partnership with Kew in the collection of seed for meadow restoration at Runnymede.	
October 18th	HEATHLANDS UNDERGROUND Britain's heathlands are of global significance for biodiversity conservation and in the last few years new information has been gained on how they function. Dr Martin Bidartondo of Imperial College, London will describe how the intimate links between fungi and plants shape our heathlands.	
November 15th	GALES, GREENHOUSES AND GLOBAL WARMING Weatherman, broadcaster and author Ian Currie will look at the numerous changes of climate across the UK - through geological time to the present time. How will this impact the UK, such as in coastal communities and what kind of weather should we expect in the future?.	
December 13th	The RESTORATION OF FARNHAM HEATH (and the Introduction of Field Crickets) Mike Coates from the RSPB will tell us all about the birds and wildlife of this once gloomy conifer plantation, which has been restored to heathland - such as crossbills, nightjars, woodcocks and tree pipits. With views across the Surrey Weald, this beautiful 100 hectares is the site of an important introduction of field crickets.	
January 17 th 2022	THE LIFE OF THE BADGER Joint Chairman of Binfield Badger Group John Fennell will reveal the extraordinary lives of badgers, allaying some of the myths and concerns people have and will explain their importance in maintaining a balanced ecology. John will describe the work the Group do in surveying, protecting and vaccinating these charismatic animals.	
February 21st	A LIFE ON THE WING Discover the amazing lives of housemartins, swifts and swallows from Barbara Polonara from House Martin Conservation UK, with an introduction to their conservation efforts, and how you can help by putting up artificial nest cups and swift bricks which provide holes for nesting
