- We participate in **ecological projects with other conservation groups** which include woodland, heathland and wetland management.
- **Bracknell Forest Veteran Tree Recording Group** is part of the Society.
- BFNHS also works closely with the **Parks and Countryside Service** of the Local Authority running public events, surveys, wild plant cultivation, etc.

Our Meetings are mostly held on the **third Monday of each month** (September to June). We meet in the **Recital Room** at **South Hill Park**, which is on the first floor of the main house. Doors open at 7.00 p.m. - Meetings start at 7.30 p.m. and end at approximately 9.30 pm.
