The woodland is beautiful in Spring - with blossom, birdsong and deer tracks all around.

The gardens at Waltham Place are naturalistic in style, an evolution that has taken many years, in line with the owner's belief that a garden should foster and support nature rather than fighting against it. The whole estate is run under biodynamic and organic principles... gardening - and farming - without the use of chemicals. The result is a vibrant ecosystem rich in life - from the invertebrates, small mammals and birds to the larger mammals and top predators that live there.
